

Vets Count Scholarship Fund

For active duty U.S. military personnel and U.S. veterans, and their immediate families (spouses or children) who are interested in pursuing financial programs to assist them in achieving their educational and career goals.

Application Information

Seeking an education during or after military service can be challenging for many reasons, including the financial burden that comes with going back to school. Our main goal is to help remove this financial barrier and assist our veterans and their families.

The scholarship will pay the registration fees for any two courses in the Financial Management Programs area (see below). Applicants who are awarded a scholarship can utilize their award beginning with the first quarter after they receive the award and need to take their first class within one year from the time the scholarship was awarded. This means if you are awarded a scholarship in November you have until the following Fall Quarter to register for and complete the first course. You have an additional year from that point forward to complete the remaining courses. Registration fees for an additional two courses may be awarded if the candidate successfully completes the first two courses, regardless of the financial management program they register for. They will have an additional year to complete these courses.

Certificate fees and textbooks are not included in the scholarship award and must be paid for separately. Scholarships are not transferable and expire one year from the award date.

The Financial Management Programs area includes the following disciplines:

- Accounting, Internal Audit & Bookkeeping
- Taxation & Enrolled Agent
- Finance & Investments
- Personal Financial Planning
- Credit Analysis & Management
- Financial Literacy

Eligibility Criteria:

Please note: UCLA Extension employees do not qualify to apply for this scholarship.

The candidates must be active or retired U.S. military personnel or be part of the immediate family (spouse or children) of such personnel.

The scholarship is not awarded based on financial need and applicants are not required to submit financial documentation.

To Apply, Candidates Must Submit:

- **For active or retired U.S. military personnel:** Proof of current or past military status (such as an activity or veteran ID card, or a DD Form 214).

Or:

- **For an eligible family member of an active or retired U.S. military personnel:** Proof of current or past military status of the family member in the military, plus proof of relationship, including (1) identity (I.D. or Driver’s License) and (2) relationship – e.g., copy of marriage or birth certificate, tax forms showing dependency relation, married filing jointly, etc.)

And:

- **A completed application form** (see below)
- **A 250-word typed essay** explaining the reason for applying and for taking courses.

Applications are awarded once a year in early November. However, you may submit your application at any time throughout the year. Applications may only be submitted via email to VetsCount@uclaextension.edu. The essay may also be submitted as a word document or in the body of the email.

Eligibility criteria for all final candidates will be checked and confirmed by UCLA Extension. Applications will not be returned.

Deadlines:

Applications must be received by the last Tuesday of October in order to be included in the November review for that year.
